WHAT IS THE EU COM ART CONTEST

The EU COM ART CONTEST is an **international initiative** of the EU COM project.

The contest opened for submissions on February 28, 2024, and closed on May 15, 2024.

It aimed to foster networking among artists and designers, enhancing their visibility and skills through transnational artistic exchange.

The contest focused on upcycling art and circular lifestyle concepts

The contest was developed through several **phases**:

- research on regulations
- drafting initial guidelines
- partner discussions
- finalization
- implementation on the platform
- continuous testing

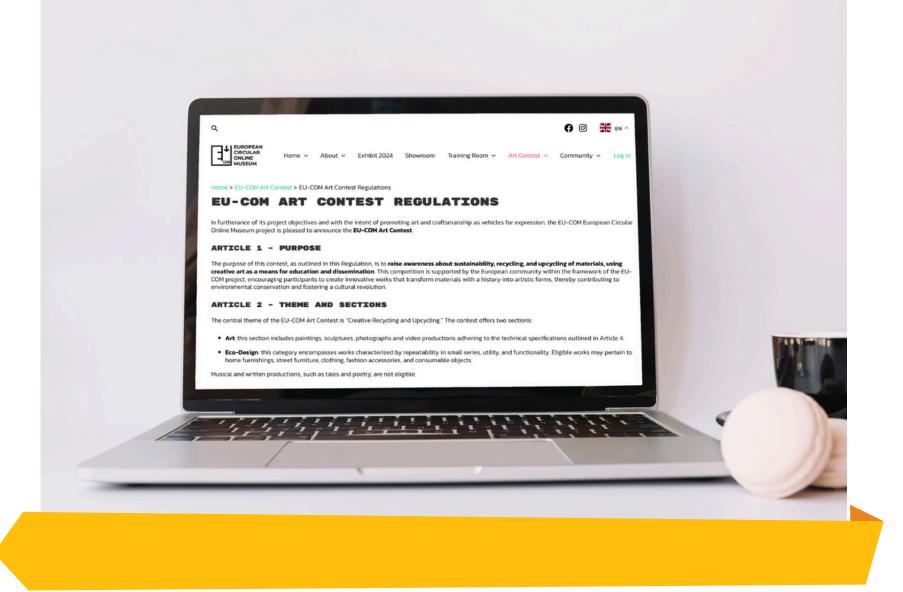
The regulations were carefully structured to ensure inclusivity, transparency, and compliance with intellectual property rights and data protection standards.

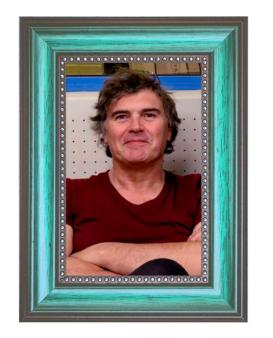


CHOOSING THE JURY

An international jury of six experts was selected, representing diverse fields such as contemporary art, sustainability, and social engagement.

The jury evaluation process followed a two-stage approach:

- national pre-selection
- final international jury evaluation

HOW WE PROMOTED THE CONTEST

A comprehensive communication plan was implemented to maximize outreach.

The strategy included targeted social media campaigns, dedicated website content, and collaboration with partners across Europe.

A strong **visual identity** was established, blending elements of pop art and creative recycling themes

The contest adopted an **online** registration system to facilitate participation and ensure accessibility.

A user-friendly form was developed, and continuous support was provided through email, social media, and in-person assistance to help participants with varying digital literacy levels.

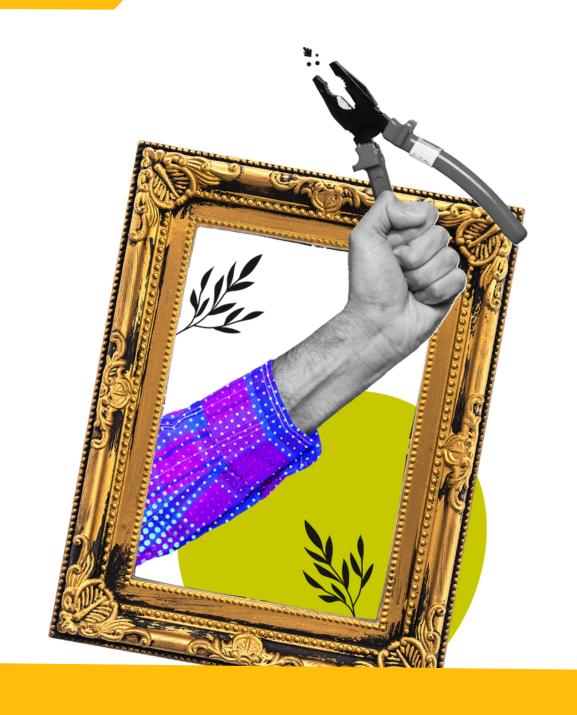

Throughout the contest, significant challenges such as **digital accessibility, file format issues**, and **deadline** extensions were addressed.

The team provided ongoing technical support and adapted processes to facilitate participation and accessibility.

CONTEST PARTICIPATION

A total of **100 participants** from **10 different European countries** joined the contest in both Art Category and Eco-Design category.

Participants were between 20 and 60 years old from 52 European cities.

The participants included both professional artists and beginners, demonstrating that the contest was open and accessible to everyone interested in upcycling and eco-friendly design.

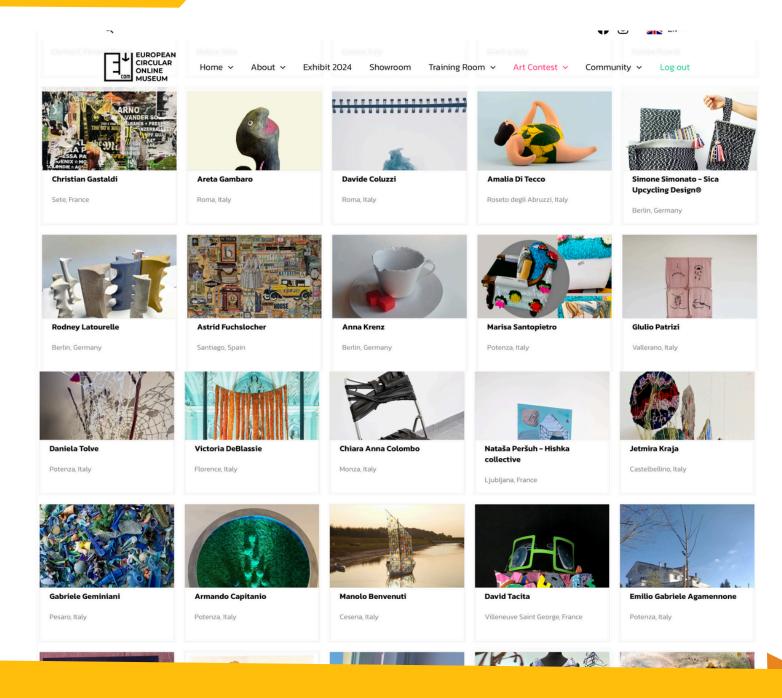

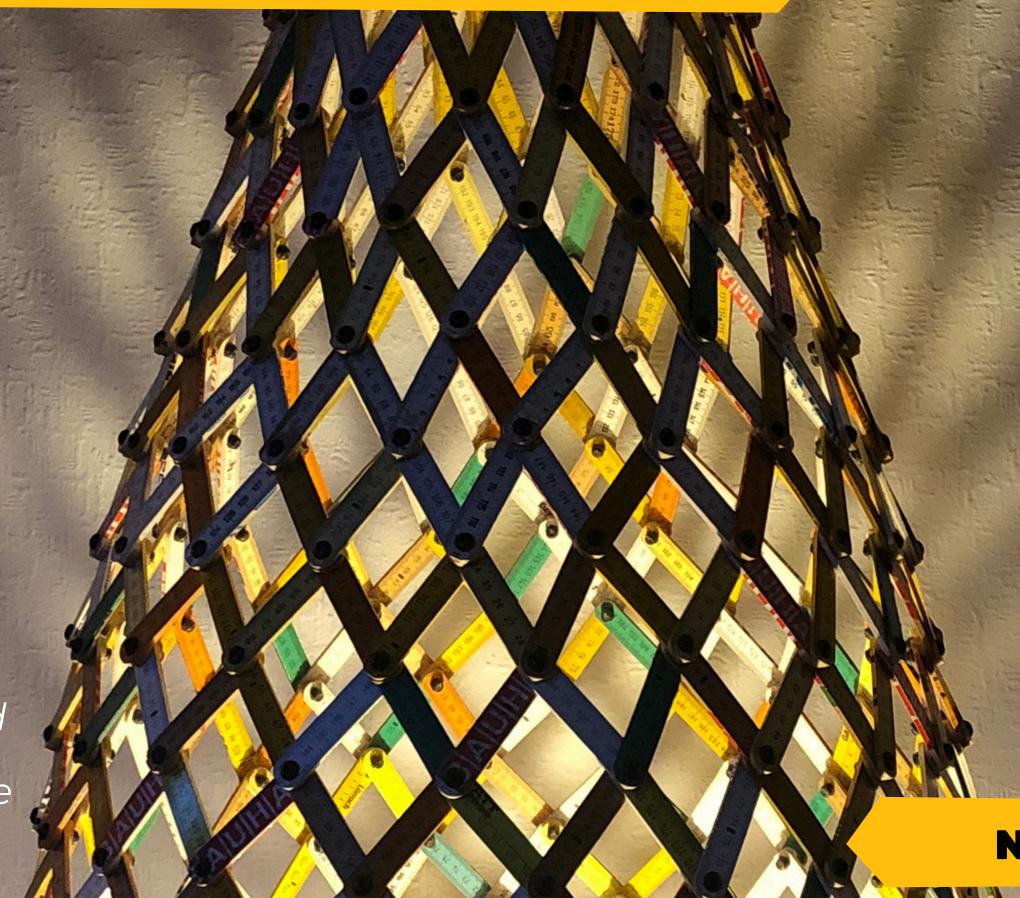
